

Nourishment for the Neshama

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A Prayer on Purim Day 5772 - Inspired by Clarity Seminar

"Please Hashem I wish to fulfill Your Vision for me so that I may bring honor to Your Name and ask that You lovingly and gently please help me to remove all obstacles to doing so. And please redeem us speedily!"

The above prayer sets forth an infinite path of connection of my soul to Hashem; He is Infinite, I am limited and finite and mortal. But by praying for it, I choose it as a goal - I properly align my existence and acknowledge the spiritual reality AND shift my self-esteem to striving to choose soul over body and THIS when said sincerely, is what unites our people through our being united to Hashem for this purpose. I and every other Jew is created to recognize our Creator, and express gratitude and sing praises to Him! Our only purpose here is to overcome the obstacles that free will sets before us that keeps us from knowing this simple utter reality, that every other creation besides mankind knows instinctively. In all the world there is nothing but the simple unity of Hashem. Every force in the world and in all of the worlds is filled only with His simple unity.

Here is the message that inspired the above, from Tzipora Harris of the Clarity Seminar:

*"On Purim... Whatever prayers are sent to Hashem are accepted" (Divrei Yechezkel p. 31)
what does this mean?*

"Jewish wisdom tells us that just as Hashem rescued us on that first Purim, so He stands by ready to rescue us every Purim. We beseech, and He answers, no matter what our merits, no matter what our flaws. Our sages explain why: "The law of tzedakah is that one is supposed to check the worthiness of the recipient. But on Purim, the law of tzedakah bids us not to scrutinize the worthiness of the recipient but to give whomever asks."

So too with Hashem and our prayers, just as we give tzedakah on Purim to all who ask, without regard to their worthiness, so too Hashem answers us without scrutinizing our worthiness (Nidvas Pi, P8)

All day long on Purim, Hashem is there, awaiting our prayers and willing to shower us with His love, His kindness and His blessings. Pray to fulfill HIS vision for your life and not your own vision. Ask that all your prayers be fulfilled in the way that is best in HIS eyes.

Through this one day of prayer and joy, we can invoke blessing, and prosperity for ourselves and the entire Jewish people."
